
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


U.S. Airline Industry Profits (Hah!)

Pre-Tax Profit Margin (% of Operating Revenues)




RDU Passenger Enplanements 1985-2020



% Change in U.S. Outbound Scheduled Passenger Flights: 3Q21 vs. 3Q19






The U.S. Travel Association Projects U.S. Business Travel to Return to 2019 Levels in 2024

"Lingering COVID restrictions and a patchwork approach to reopening across the country will prevent the economically crucial business travel segment from recovering until at least 2024... Travel overall is by far the U.S. industry hardest hit by the ongoing fallout of the COVID-19 pandemic." (U.S. Travel Association, June 2021)




Recovery of Global Business Travel Spending Projected to Take Five Years

Austin, Boston and Raleigh-Durham are among the mini-hubs the major carriers will be fighting over this year, to the benefit of air passengers (April 28, 2021)

Airlines Chasing Business Travelers

- --Delta concentrating on Austin, Raleigh-Durham and Boston
- --JetBlue up to 10 cities from 3 in June
- --American adding flights
- --Point-to-point, not to hubs

-- July scheduled flights still 35% lower than 2019
